MORE HELP FOR CHILDREN

...with launch of Outreach Medical Programme

In this issue Florencia, the Secretary of the Bambang Sunshine Project, reports on the hectic three weeks she spent in the Philippines just before Christmas. While she was there she shared in the start of the Outreach Medical Programme. Although previously, children in the Project were seen by a doctor and their illnesses diagnosed, little practical help was possible. Under the Outreach Medical Programme, the Project has been able to take children to specialist doctors in the neighbouring province of Isabella and to the Makati Medical Centre in Manila. Now for example, the children who are suffering from epilepsy and similar illnesses, are seen regularly and are getting medication that helps control their fits.

Florencia praises the active and committed Partner Committee members and volunteers in the Philippines who make sure the activities of the Project are carried out. One of their breakthroughs, is slowly but surely discovering from government officials what help may be obtained for the children and their families.

REPORT FROM THE PARTNER COMMITTEE

The UK committee raises funds for use by the Partner Committee in the Philippines.

We have been conducting regular home visits to beneficiaries, giving them moral support and updating them medically. 31 disabled children have been enrolled this school year 2004/5, in public schools within their locality. All 31 children were provided with school supplies such as uniforms, bags, raincoats, notebooks and pencils. 3 Deaf children were enrolled in the Solano East Central School, the only public school offering free education to these children. The Project has met the cost of the fare to Solano. We have been conducting seminars on Health Awareness, caring and handling disabled children. Our work is proving valuable to children with disabilities and their carers, and we know it is helping to break down the cultural barrier of having a disabled child, by our compassionate approach. So much so, that there are many others coming forward who we cannot help. We would like to ask readers to help us continue the work we are doing. Your donations, however small, are always welcome and will enable this project to maintain and perhaps extend its services.

Florencia's Visit to the Philippines

Week One - A seminar/workshop

Florencia attended a seminar/workshop about the vision for the future of the Project, which was held for Partner Committee members and volunteers. This was a follow-up on the report by the Project's UK Chairman and Sue Beavis, our website designer, when they explored the Project's Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats on their visit last year. Everyone actively participated and agreed that the seminar had given them a better understanding of their roles and a clearer view of what then project could do for the children in the future.

Week Two - Early Christmas Party

Christmas was celebrated early with a party for the children and their carers. There was a well organised programme by the Partner Committee and they were helped by the volunteers with the activities for the children. There were games, dancing, singing and face painting, which the children and their carers enjoyed. Town officials and community leaders were also invited and they promised full support to the Project. The Chairman of the Parents/Carers committee expressed their appreciation of the Project, which made them feel supported and valued. The visiting UK Committee Members distributed Christmas parcels to the excited children before everyone shared and enjoyed Christmas lunch. The party culminated in the children and their carers giving a touching rendition of a Filipino Thank You song, which they dedicated to the UK Committee, all donors and supporters of the Project.

Week Three - Outreach Medical Programme Started

Our Outreach Medical Programme was started when Florencia and two other committee members travelled 50 miles to the clinic of a doctor who checked four of the children suffering from cerebral palsy and epilepsy. These children are now being helped by the medication that the doctor prescribed. Also during the week, Florencia had a meeting with the parents and carers committee to find out what their thoughts, aspirations and expectations were from the project.

OUTREACH MEDICAL PROGRAMME IN ACTION

As well as taking children with cerebral palsy and epilepsy to a clinic fifty miles away where they were examined, and prescribed treatment, the Outreach Medical Programme was able to arrange for two children with cleft palates to be operated on. The operations were carried out at the provincial hospital of Nueva Vizcaya. This was



under a government programme offered to families who are unable to pay for the operations. We would like to thank the Mayor for providing the municipal ambulance to transport the children to the clinic or hospital.

We are now slowly discovering ways of helping the children and their families, by building up contacts with local government officials and community workers, who have the knowledge of new government programmes, that charge minimal fees or even give free treatment, to people with disabilities who cannot afford to pay.
